



Paper Plate Dragon

- ❖ Students complete a dragon craft this week to go along with all the tales of knights and dragons. This mask can be used in role playing during the week or at co-op.

Before Co-op Meeting:

1. Review History Overview (Handbook) to understand philosophy and ideas behind this week's lesson.

Lesson Goals:

1. To complete a hands-on craft to enrich the student's play acting experience.

At Co-op Preparation:

- Have all materials laid out and ready before the lesson.
- If necessary have paper towels and cleaning spray ready for clean-up time.

In Class:

1. Explain to the students that they will make a dragon mask today.
2. Ask if they remember the story of St. George and the Dragon from last week.
 - Encourage students to use the mask during the week to re-enact the stories they hear. You might also conclude today's class with a short role-play of St. George conquering the dragon.

Clean-up:

- If necessary, use paper towels and cleaning spray to clean the tables if needed.
