Notes:

- (1) Completely demonstrate a new activity BEFORE allowing the child access.
- (2) Do not introduce more than three activities in one day.
- (3) Do not allow play at random with activities until they are mastered.
- (4) Allow the child 45 minutes of “School Time” per day, then have her put everything away before continuing with the day’s other activities.
- (5) Always supervise the child during this time of school.
- (6) Before leaving the classroom for the day, every activity begun by the child must be successfully completed and returned to its place.
